A Message from the President

Greeting Fellow Lions,

It's January – the start of a new calendar year and the mid-point of the Lions program year. It seems like a good time to evaluate our progress towards the goals we set at the start of this program year.

- **Goal:** Continue our tradition of community service through projects such as Christmas Food Basket; Toys for Tots; scholarships for LaVille High School graduates; financial support for Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, FFA, 4-H, and other local youth programs; eyeglass and hearing aid recycling programs; vision screening at the LUMC day-care; and contributions to state projects and LCIF.
Progress: Our Christmas Food Basket and Toys for Tots projects provided food baskets for at least 70 families and toys for more than 200 children. Community response to these projects was so great that we had more than \$500 left over to set aside in a new Family Relief Fund. We continue to provide financial support to local youth programs, participate in eyeglass and hearing aid recycling programs, and contribute to state projects and LCIF. We are planning a vision screening at the LUMC day-care in the spring.
- **Goal:** Find new ways to serve our community.
Progress: In October, we participated in the first-ever Halloween Trick-or-Treat Walk at Newton Park, and gave Lions Mints to approximately 1,000 children. In December, we contributed \$5,000 towards the purchase of new playground equipment for the James M. Culp Memorial Park on Main Street in Lakeville. The equipment has been purchased and will be installed in the spring.
- **Goal:** Implement a membership recruitment program, and a membership orientation program, and achieve in a net increase of at least 6 new members during this program year.
Progress: Our membership information breakfast in November brought in 6 new members, and we have a total of 9 new members so far this year. The membership committee has a new member orientation session scheduled for January 20th.
- **Goal:** Increase attendance at board meetings and dinner meetings, and participation in club projects.
Progress: We have experienced month-to-month increases in attendance at dinner meetings, average attendance at board meetings has increased, and we had a great turn-out for our recent Christmas projects.
- **Goal:** Increase our club's participation in district and state Lions events.
Progress: Last year, 2 Lakeville Lions attended the Indiana Lions Mid-Winter Conference in Indianapolis; this year, 5 Lakeville Lions took advantage of this opportunity to share and learn. Last year, 2 or 3 members attended District Cabinet meetings; at least 8 plan to attend the District Cabinet meeting on January 24th.

We are off to a great start, and I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has contributed to the success of our efforts, so far, but there is still much work to be done to address unmet needs in our community. I look forward to continuing to work with each of you as "We Serve" our community.
