rissa's therapy dog.



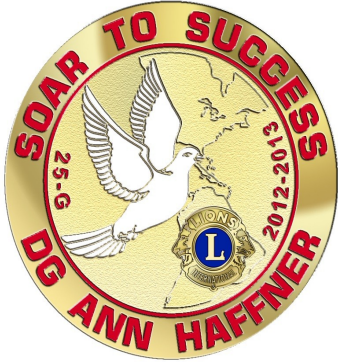
At the final District
