On Sunday, October 27th, we will participate in the Halloween Walk at Newton Park. On Thursday, October 31st, we will sponsor our long-running Community Halloween Party at Newton Center. The Dictionary Project is complete for the 2013-2014 school year. Dictionaries were distributed to 3rd-graders at LaVille Elementary School and 3 private schools on the south side of South Bend.

Several Lions attended the recent Cub Scout Pack 247 Rain Gutter Regatta. What a race it was!

The Scoutmaster and Troop Committee Chairman from Boy Scout Troop 247 attended our October business meeting and reported on the troop's activities for the past year. Six boys are currently working to complete the requirements for the rank of Eagle Scout. The troop will re-charter in December with 22 boys and 12 adult leaders.

The club is offering two incentive programs to increase membership:

- The price for dinner at the monthly dinner meeting will be increased by 50 cents per person. This money will be set aside and paid to the first member who brings in a completed application for a new member, with the initiation fee and pro-rated dues for the remainder of the current Lions year.
- A member who brings in a new member with initiation fee, pro-rated dues for the remainder of the current year, and full dues for next year will get the LCI portion of their dues paid by the club for one year. This is \$43.00 for regular members and \$21.50 for family members.

These incentives are mutually exclusive; a sponsor may choose one or the other, but not both. You must be a member in good standing with your dues paid current in order to receive either incentive award.

At the October dinner meeting, a representative of the Indiana Attorney General's Office will speak on scams and other fraudulent activity targeting Indiana residents. Please contact Lion Jean Barlow to make dinner meeting reservations.

It is not easy to be recognized as a good club in Lionism. The Lakeville Lions Club is recognized as such and to maintain that position requires the effort of all members in whatever small or big way that they can. Officers: our first job is to lead and initiate. Members: yours is to participate and contribute as you can. That's our challenge.
