Operation KidSight: We work with Lions Clubs throughout St. Joseph County to provide vision screening for children between 1 and 6 years of age in day care centers, pre-schools, and kindergartens throughout St. Joseph County. In most cases, a team of 3 volunteers is sufficient.

Operation SchoolSight: This is our new project to assist school nurses with state-mandated visual acuity testing for children in grades 1, 3, 5, and 8. We need 7-10 volunteers for each session.
