
Lion President Vic promises an AWESOME letter next month.



In late September and early October, 19 Lions representing 6 Lions Clubs in District 25-G travelled to Huanimaro, Guanajuato, Mexico and worked with the Huanimaro Lions Club to provide eye exams and eyeglasses to more than 3200 adults and children in the city of Huanimaro. More than 10 percent of the city's residents were served by this mission. The Huanimaro Lions Club has only 7 members, but has sponsored 2 eyeglass missions in Huanimaro and 1 mission in nearby Abasolo since 2014.

The eyeglasses provided by this mission were collected by clubs throughout the district. The glasses were sorted and washed by volunteers from several clubs, then each pair was "read" on a lensomoter to determine the prescription in each lens. Each pair of glasses was packaged in a plastic bag with a label showing the prescription. Finally the glasses were packed for shipping to the Huanimaro Lions Club.

PDG Paul Russell of the Lakeville Lions Club is pictured with a young girl who received a pair of glasses. PDG Paul described her reaction. "I handed a pair of glasses to this girl and watched her face light up with joy as she looked around the room and saw clearly for what was probably the first time in her life. It is moments like this that keep us going on these missions."

On Saturday, October 14, members of the Lakeville Lions worked at the Lakeville Fall Festival. We served free donuts and cider in the morning and hot dogs, chips, and soda in the afternoon. Lion Lissa Newton estimates that we gave away 125 hot dogs and 108 donuts. Some of the leftovers were given to a free breakfast program at Community Baptist Church. Thanks to all of the Lions who worked to help make the town festival a success. Lion Jennifer made contact with 9 people who expressed interest in club membership. Thanks to Lion Max who fixed the floor in the trailer so that we could use it!



The Lakeville Lions Club voted at the October board meeting to provide financial support for the LaVille Lancer Pride program. This program rewards students for good attendance. 
