Bowling Recap

Our Lions Club sponsored an incentive trip for LaVille Jr. - Sr. High School students grades 7 - 12. 138 students and 4 adult chaperones went to Chippewa Bowling Alley on Friday January 19th. Everyone enjoyed 2 hours of bowling. To qualify for the "Lancer Pride Club" every 9 week grading period, a student must earn a "C" average (and no "F" grades), have an attendance rate of 96% and must have 2 or less referrals to the office for any type of behavior concerns. The students do not have to make the honor roll. The students who earned the chance to go bowling met the requirements for **both** of the 9 week grading periods in the first semester. The best news is a total of 218 students were eligible to go bowling! If these same students meet all the requirements for the 3rd grading period that ends in March, they will be rewarded with an outing to see the South Bend Cubs play at Four Winds Field at Coveleski Stadium on May 9th. Our Club has allocated money for that trip as well! Placing an emphasis on student success is just another way WE SERVE!


