- *Lion Howard, Chairman of the Dictionary Project, announced that there is some interest in starting this project in Nappanee.
- *Lion Jim Tillman announced that there has been a lot of progress in renovating our 4-H Fair food booth. New countertops have been installed, the freezer is fixed, there is new lighting and everything has been given a fresh coat of paint
- *Lion Lissa Newton announced that the LaVille machine shop class is currently working to renovate our box for the Little Free Public Library. This box was donated by the Plymouth Pilot and will be installed in Culp Park.
- *The Board had an extensive discussion on ways that the Lions can help Camp Millhouse. This camp serves special needs children and adults. They recently purchased the land where the camp is located and now they are looking for help with needed repairs. This includes a water heater for the pool, a water filtration system and a general cleaning and updating of the cabins. The camp is in need of volunteers as well. The Board voted to present these needs to the general membership at the next dinner meeting to see if there is interest in helping the camp.
- *Lion Larry Ort reported that the 4-H Fair Board is purchasing 20-30 new picnic tables for use at the fair. The Lions Board of Directors voted to sponsor a table for \$200.

- 6:00 Rooster Crow Contest and Chicken Dance Lap

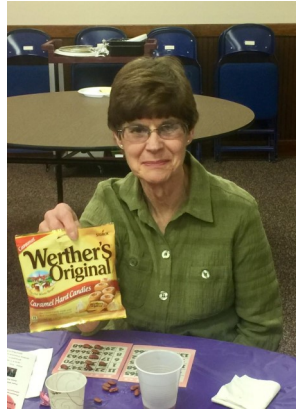
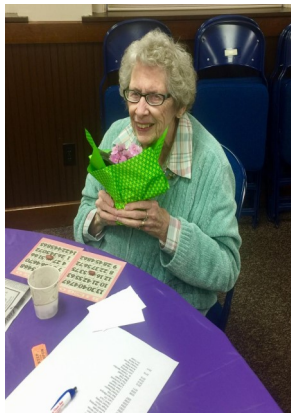
