## *A Message from the President*

Greetings Fellow Lions,

It's January – the start of a new calendar year and the mid-point of the Lions program year. It seems like a good time to evaluate our progress towards the goals we set at the start of this Lions year.

**Goal:** Continue our tradition of community service through projects such as Christmas Food Basket; Toys for Tots; scholarships for LaVille High School graduates; financial support for Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, 4-H, and other local youth programs; eyeglass and hearing aid recycling programs; Operation KidSight vision screenings; and contributions to state projects and LCIF.

**Progress:** Our Christmas Food Basket and Toys for Tots projects provided food baskets for nearly 40 families and toys for more than 100 children. Left-over food was distributed to food pantries at local churches. Left-over stuffed toys were given to the Lakeville Police Department and Union-North Ambulance Service, to be given to children dealing with traumatic situations, and other left-over toys were distributed to the Lakeville United Methodist Church, Salvation Army Kroc Center, and a local women's shelter.

We continue to provide financial support to local youth programs, participate in eyeglass and hearing aid recycling programs, and contribute to state projects, the Indiana Lions Foundation, and LCIF.

During the first 6 months of the current Lions years, our vision screening team screened 996 children in 27 screening sessions. We are the #1 club in the state of Indiana in terms of the number of children screened by a single club during this time period.

**Goal:** Find new ways to serve our community.

**Progress:** We started the Little Free Library project in the spring, so it's not really new this year, but it is moving along and our Little Free Library should be installed in the shelter in Culp Park within the next few weeks. Let's keep looking for more ways to serve our community.

**Goal:** Implement a membership recruitment program, and a membership orientation program, and achieve in a net increase of at least 6 new members during this program year.

**Progress:** We have not yet implemented a membership program. We have welcomed 1 new member and 1 transfer member, and we lost 1 member who transferred to another club, so we have a net increase in membership of 1 member for the first 6 months of the Lions year. Each of us joined the Lakeville Lions Club because someone offered us the opportunity to make a difference in our community. Each of us needs to extend that same offer to family members, friends, and co-workers.

**Goal:** Increase attendance at board meetings and dinner meetings, and participation in club projects.

**Progress:** We have experienced nominal increases in attendance at dinner meetings and board meetings, and we had a great turn-out for our recent Christmas projects.

**Goal:** Increase our club's participation in district and state Lions events.

**Progress:** We don't seem to be making any progress in this area.

We are off to a good start, but we can do better. I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has contributed to the success of our efforts, so far, but there is still much work to be done to address unmet needs in our community. I look forward to continuing to work with each of you as "We Serve" our community.

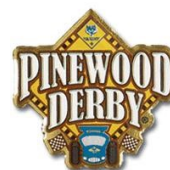


### Tail Twister's Tip
