### News From The Board of Directors

- We have screened more than 1,000 children so far during this Lions year, and we have 7 more schools on the schedule in the next month. Please call PDG Paul Russell or Lion Rose Russell if you would like to volunteer. They can be reached at 784-9094.
- The 4-H Fair food booth sign up sheets will be available at the March dinner meeting.
- We will have a 4-H Fair food booth cleanup day scheduled in mid-May. The booth needs to be cleaned before the St. Joseph County Relay for Life since we will be participating in that event on June 1-2.
- The Scholarship Committee recommended that we change the residency requirements for the scholarships that we provide at LaVille High School. An applicant for a Lakeville Lions Club scholarship must be a graduating senior at LaVille High School and either (a) a resident of Union Township, or (b) a resident of St. Joseph County outside of Union Township and have attended LaVille High School for 4 years (9th –12th grade). The Board voted to approve this change.
- The Board voted to sponsor the LaVille High School Summit Awards Banquet.
- The Board discussed the Camp Millhouse Work Day. This will be Saturday, May 4th, from 7:30am through 2:00pm. You do not need to sign up ahead of time to attend this event. Bring gloves and a rake if you have them. Comcast will donate \$15 to Camp Millhouse for each volunteer who shows up to work on this day,. Camp Millhouse is located at 25600 Kelly Road in South Bend.
- Last month, the Board voted to sponsor two village wells in Nepal. We received additional information about this project at the board meeting. We expect to receive photos of at least one of the wells in the near future.
- The Board approved transfer applications for 4 new members: Linda Andersen, Dennis Ingles, Sharon Ingles, and Eugene Povlock. Please welcome our new members.
- The Board voted to approve an expansion of the Dictionary Project. We will provide Spanish-English dictionaries to third-grade students at Our Lady of Hungary School in South Bend, and standard student dictionaries to third-grade students at St. Joseph School in South Bend. This expansion is a partnership with the South Bend Lions Club.
- Volunteers are needed for the Newton Park Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, April 20th. Contact Lion Jim Tillman at 291-6437 or 360-5705 to sign up.
- The Board voted to make a donation to Lions Club International Foundation.
- The Board voted to make a donation to support the LaVille High School After-Prom Committee.
- The Board voted make a donation to support LaVille high School's participation in the DECA (Distributive Education Clubs of America) national conference. The current district president is a student at LaVille. DECA is a non-profit career and technical student organization which prepares emerging leaders and entrepreneurs in marketing, finance, hospitality and management in high schools and colleges around the globe.

## Christmas Projects Wrap-Up

Lions Lissa Newton and Jim Tillman submitted their final report for the 2018 Christmas Toys for Tots and Food Basket projects. They reported the following:

- The Elementary School food drive brought in 3,526 food items. This was the second highest number of donations since the project was started. Palmer Community Complex allowed us to sort and store these items at their facility.
- A number of local businesses helped with the project by allowing us to put drop off boxes at their locations. These businesses were Dollar General stores in Lakeville, LaPaz and Gilmer Park, Union North United School Corporation, Leo's Restaurant, LaPaz Fire Station, BP Gas in Lakeville and Palmer Community Complex.
- In partnership with the LaPaz Lions, we sponsored two Blitz days this year.
- For Distribution Day, we served 156 individuals in 36 families. Of these, 109 were children.
- Leftover toys were divided up and given to the Lakeville United Methodist Church to support the Women's Domestic Violence Shelter at the YWCA in South Bend. The remainder were given to the Kroc Center to support the families they identified as needing help from the Toys for Tots program.
- The Town of Lakeville Police Officers that were present took toys and/or stuffed animals for their squad cars to be given to children for any reason.
- Leftover food was given to food pantries/community outreach programs at Faith Christian Chapel, Lakeville United Methodist Church and County Line Brethren Church.
- Avon items were donated by Darlene Shock's mother, Phyllis Pratt.
- The Lakeville Masonic Lodge donated three bicycles that were given away.
- An anonymous donor gave \$400 to be used for gift/hygiene baskets to be given to children 12 and up. Crossroads Community Church assembled baskets for children in the same age range.
- An anonymous donation allowed us to buy gift cards for some of the older children. These were purchased through the Script program at Lakeville United Methodist church, allowing the church to receive a 4% donation from the Script program.



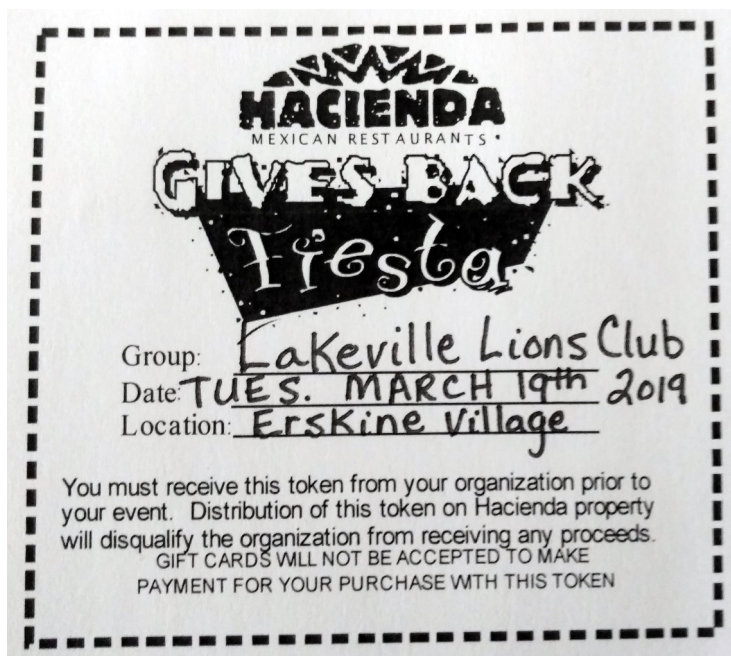
**WE WANT YOU!**

## **Lakeville Lions Club Awards Guidelines**

### **Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF) & W.P. Woods Fellowship (WPWF)**

MJF recipient must meet requirements established by Lions Club International Foundation.

WPWF recipient must meet requirements established by Indiana Lions Foundation.

### **Lion of the Year**

Recipient must be a member in good standing of the Lakeville Lions Club.

Recipient must have been a Lion for at least one year; recipient may have transferred to the Lakeville Lions Club from another Lions Club within the past year.

Recipient must have:

Served as the chairperson or co-chairperson of a Lakeville Lions Club service project or fund-raising project within the past year; OR

Served as an officer or director of the Lakeville Lions Club within the past year; OR

Demonstrated exceptional leadership in the course of their Lions Club activities within the past year.

### **Everyday Hero Award**

Recipient must be a member in good standing of the Lakeville Lions Club, or a family member of a member in good standing of the Lakeville Lions Club.

Recipient must have demonstrated a commitment to the spirit of Lionism through consistent support of and participation in Lakeville Lions Club service projects and fund-raising projects within the past year, without necessarily serving as a project chairman or co-chairman, or an officer or director of the club.

### **Community Service Award**

Recipient may be any individual or organization in the Lakeville community.

Recipient must have demonstrated a commitment to the spirit of Lionism through their contributions to the betterment of the Lakeville community.

Nominations may be submitted by any member in good standing (dues paid current) of the Lakeville Lions Club. Nominations must be submitted to the Awards Committee chairperson or his/her designee by the dinner meeting in March.

Awards recipients will be selected by a vote all members in good standing (dues paid current) of the Lakeville Lions Club who are present at the dinner meeting in April. Voting will be conducted by the chairperson of the Awards Committee or his/her designee. Voting will be done by secret ballot and the results will NOT be announced until the awards are presented.
