A Message from the President

Greetings Fellow Lions,

What do Lions do? What would you say if someone asked you that question? You might start by talking about some of our local service projects.

One of my favorite projects is the Dictionary Project. The purpose of the Dictionary Project is to provide students with personal dictionaries which they can keep and use for personal reference. The Dictionary Project targets students in the third grade because educators consider this the transition year between "learning to read" and "reading to learn". The Dictionary Project was started in South Carolina in 1995. Since then, it has expanded to all 50 states and several foreign countries.

The Lakeville Lions Club has been a Dictionary Project sponsor since 2007, when Lion Howard Heines saw a news article about the South Bend Kiwanis providing dictionaries to third-grade students in the South Bend schools and suggested that we should do the same at LaVille Elementary School. When the Centre Township Lions Club folded in 2011, we adopted the private and parochial schools which they had been serving. This Spring, we expanded our service area again when we partnered with the South Bend Lions Club to provide dictionaries to students in two Catholic schools in South Bend. During the 2018-2019 school year, we provided dictionaries to 223 third-grade students in 6 elementary schools.

I always enjoy participating in the distribution of dictionaries and the students and teachers are always grateful for the gift. Just this morning, we received a "thank you" note from a student who recently received a dictionary from the Lakeville Lions Club and the South Bend Lions Club. (I have corrected her spelling to make it easier to read.)

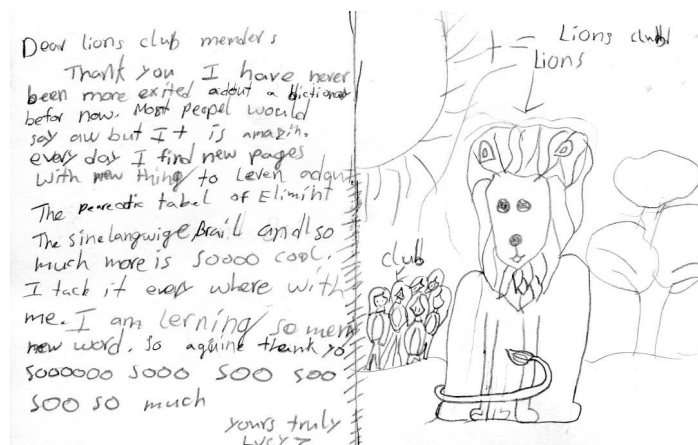

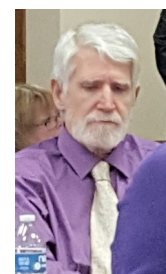
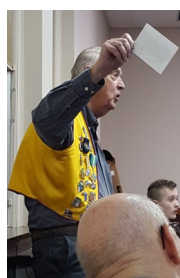
